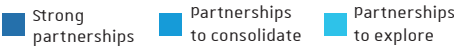
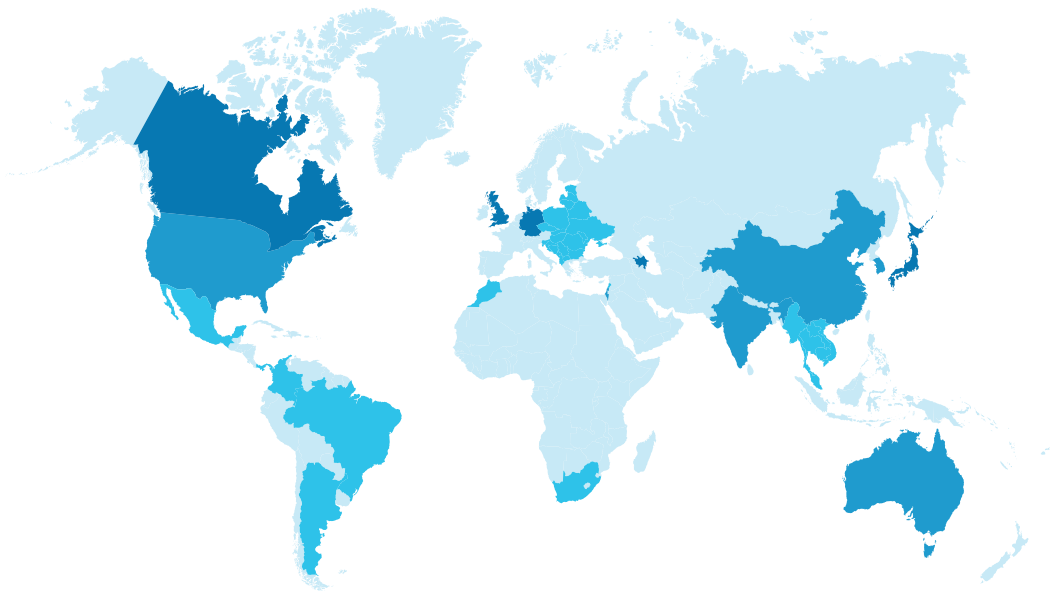

# Our International Relations Office - IRO

The IRO mission is to implement the international policy developed and led by the Vice-Presidency for Europe and International Relations. At the institutional level, this strategy relies on advising the university's audiences on international opportunities, in collaboration with campus partners. A major goal is to prepare our community to be mindful about different cultural backgrounds, to respect the multiple dimensions of our populations' identities and cultivate an inclusive environment.

Around 35 staff members provide expertise on internationalisation, oversee partnership development with other institutions and apply for EU funding to support international credentials and mobility for all. In recent years, the IRO has devoted important resources to offer a welcoming and supportive environment for international students and staff. In 2019, the University of Strasbourg was awarded the label of excellence "Bienvenue en France" that recognizes the high quality of its assistance and guidance.
